

The 'India-UK partnership to address farmed animal diseases and health' funding opportunity (FADH) is a joint programme between UKRI-BBSRC and the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India (DBT), funded on the UK side by the International Science Partnerships Fund.

Proposals were assessed in parallel by assessment committees in India and the UK, appointed respectively by DBT and UKRI-BBSRC. The final funding decision was jointly made by the two funders based on the recommendation of the two committees and with the input of committee chairs.
