Empower

Empower urban communities to have the agency and opportunity to enable growth and address equitable distribution.

Seek

Seek to reorient academic practice and policy design towards cocreated, mission-led outcomes and recommendations.



Listen

Listen to people-centred, community-led research agendas, build the evidence base collectively and co-create design of urban cultural policy.

Enable

Enable resource to support partnerships that honour cultural identities and facilitate creative expression in urban contexts.

AHRC Locally Unlocking Culture through Inclusive Access (LUCIA) programme

- AHRC to fund up to 5 locally-led pilot networks to enhance access to culture, co-create design of cultural policy and promote inclusion and integration of marginalised communities across the UK.
- Build equitable cross-sector partnerships together across communities, researchers and policymakers.
- Each network up to £100,000 (full economic cost) for 12 months
 Starting April 2026.

LUCIA call overview: Equitability

EDI emphasis for the LUCIA programme

Importance of equitable partnerships

Inclusion of expertise by experience

Working alongside the UKRI and British Academy funded EDI Caucus

LUCIA call overview: Eligibility

Applications should be led by a strong, interdisciplinary leadership team who can articulate a clear shared vision for the network. We would expect that at least one member of the leadership team will hold demonstrable experience in research within the cities and urban environments area. We're keen to stress here too, the importance of the proposed use of arts and humanities research methodologies.

Project lead: Standard AHRC eligibility criteria will apply to this funding opportunity for project leads and project coleads, and you must be a resident in the UK and be hosted by an eligible research organisation (higher education institutions or recognised independent research organisations) as stated in the **AHRC Research Funding Guide**

Project co-leads from cultural, cultural policy and civic discourse, and other relevant sectors, as well as representation from people with expertise by experience, **must be included** as part of the leadership team. Where justified, the time of these project co-leads can be listed under 'Exceptions' and will be funded at 100% fEC.

LUCIA call overview: Key information

Costing: costs associated with the networks will as standard be charged at 80% of the full Economic Cost, however, project co-leads who are not based within a research organisation are eligible to claim costs at 100% of the full Economic Cost. To note: 100% fEC 'Exceptions' costs are only for staff time and cannot include estates and indirect costs

Importance of Notification of Intent to submit an application: This will enable us to assemble an assessment panel who hold appropriate expertise within the research areas covered in these indicative applications. It will also enable the AHRC to flag any research proposals with complementary elements for potential networking purposes.

Watch this space: We're currently building an additional LUCIA Fellowship - we're working alongside the Local Government Association (LGA), and hoping to launch an opportunity in January to apply to be an ECR Fellow hosted by the LGA, which will facilitate relationship building with individuals working in local and regional government.
